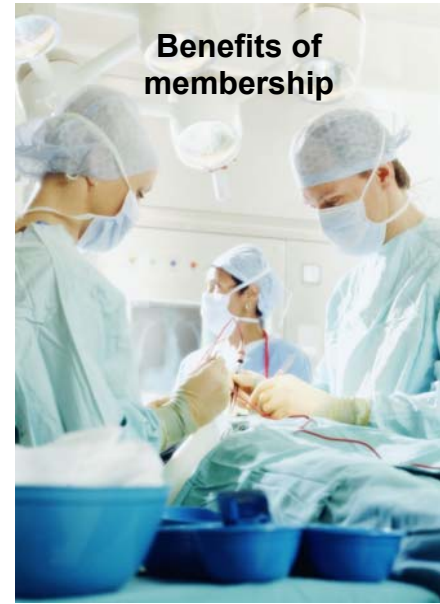
Publications
